ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN

Any Minnesota State  
College  
AND  
Metropolitan State University

The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities is authorized by Minnesota Statute 13A.01, subd. 1, to enter into Agreements and has delegated this authority to colleges and universities.

This Agreement is entered into between Any Minnesota State College (the sending institution), and Metropolitan State University (the receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

The sending institution has established Associate of Science (AS) programs, and the receiving institution has established an Individualized Studies B.A. program (the receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer from the sending institution to the receiving institution. It is mutually agreed that the sending institution will facilitate credit transfer from the sending institution to the receiving institution.

#### Admission and Graduation Requirements

- The receiving institution's admission and graduation requirements apply to students who transfer under this agreement.
- Students must fulfill the graduation requirements at the receiving institution.
- Students must complete the entire sending program and meet the receiving institution's admission requirements for the receiving program to apply.

#### Transfer of Credits

- The receiving institution will accept up to 70 credits from the sending institution's programs to apply to the 120 credit Individualized Studies B.A. 48 credits remain in to complete the BA degree. A total of 40 upper division credits must be completed in the receiving institution's program.
- Courses will transfer as described in the articulation agreement between the sending and receiving institutions, once approved by the receiving institution's faculty.

#### Audit

#### Implementation and Review

- The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and implementing articulation agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, and reviewing the agreement on a periodic basis.
- This Articulation Agreement is effective on 7/01/2018 and shall remain in effect until the end date of 7/01/2023 or for a period of 90 days or less if written notice is provided.
- The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties on 7/01/2019 (within 12 months of the end date).
- When a student petitions the receiving institution of their intent to transfer under this agreement, the sending institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.

### Instructions

- Credits applied: the receiving institution course credit amount may be more or less than the sending institution credit amount. Enter the number of credits that the receiving institution will apply toward degree completion.
- Show equivalent university-college courses.
- Equiv/Sub/Wav column: If a course is to be encoded as equivalent, enter Equiv. If a course is to be accepted by the university as a "substitution" only for the purposes of this agreement, enter Sub. If a course requirement is waived by the receiving institution, enter Wav. If a course is to be accepted by the university as a MnTC goal area, restricted elective or unrestricted elective, leave blank.
